KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

Prof. Driss BENLARBI Ph.D is professor of Sociology and coordinator of the Sociology department at the Faculty of Arts and Humanities, Moulay Ismail University of Meknes, Morocco. His research is about sociology of family, sociology of school, social movement, Amazigh movement. He also has an experience as an actor of many associations and Moroccan social society.

PhD. Gerard WEBER is an Associate Professor in the Department of Social Sciences at Bronx Community College of the City University of New York. He completed his doctorate in anthropology at the Graduate Center of the City University of New York in 2009. His dissertation, which was based upon long-term research supported by a Fulbright-Hays Doctoral Dissertation Research Award, is entitled *Forsaken generation: Stress, social suffering and strategies among working-class pensioners in post-socialist Moldova, Romania*. It focuses on the lives of working-class retirees in Galati, Romania during the transformation from socialism to capitalism. Portions of his dissertation have been published in the following academic journals and on-line: Analize: Journal of Gender and Feminist Studies; Transylvanian Review; The Council for European Studies – Critcom: A Forum for Research & Commentary on Europe; Human Organization: Journal of the Society for Applied Anthropology; Synergy; and Anthropology Now. During 2019, he is on sabbatical leave and has returned to Galati to conduct research on migration trends and their implications.







Oleksandr Evgenievich LYSENKO Doctor of Historical Sciences. Professor. Honored Worker of Science and Technology of Ukraine. Laureate of the State Prize of Ukraine in the field of science and technology in 2017. Head of the Department of History of Ukraine during the Second World War of the Institute of History of Ukraine of the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine. Member of editorial boards of magazines: "Ukrainian Historical Magazine", "Pages of Military History of Ukraine", "Military Historical Meridian". Member of the specialized academic councils for the defense of the dissertations of the Institute of History of Ukraine and the National University of Defense of Ukraine Ivan Chernyakhovsky.

Member of the Academic Council of the National Museum of Ukrainian History in the Second World War. Memorial Complex ". Author of 450 scientific publications, including more than 20 individual and collective monographs, archaeological publications, teaching aids. Sphere of scientific interests: methodology and historiography, history of the Second World War, social history, military anthropology, history of religion and church, history of everyday life. Member of the Ukrainian-German and Ukrainian-Slovak Commission of Historians.
